VISION

To provide emergency responders with the first nationwide, high-speed, wireless broadband dedicated to public safety.

GOVERNANCE


California created the California First Responder Network Board of Directors that consists of 12 multi-disciplinary representatives, with a cross-section of public safety expertise.

FACTS










California Fault Map
